## INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

**General.** Submissions must follow the Instructions to the authors carefully, and sent to the Editor by e-mail (helen.r.martins@uac.pt). The text should be in English, ready for publishing and carefully checked for all errors. MSS will be blind peer-reviewed by two referees prior to their acceptance by the Editor. Only original material will be considered and texts will be screened for plagiarism. ARQUIPELAGO – Life and Marine Sciences holds copyrights of all published material which cannot be used without permission.

**Language.** The journal is published in English. Manuscripts with unsatisfactory English language will not be accepted.

**Style.** 1) Title and 2) Authors' names, followed by 3) Abstract (not exceeding 200 words), up to five keywords, and (4) authors' names and professional postal addresses; 5) The main text; 6) Acknowledgements; 7) References; 8) Appendices; 9) Tables with legends 9) List of figures with legends and 10) List of figures with legends.

For research articles the text (4) must be organized as follows: Introduction; Material and Methods; Results; Discussion. The Abstract (3) should convey the scope of the paper, emphasizing the results and conclusions, not merely describing its contents. Limit the authors' professional addresses (4) to official affiliations.

**References.** (6) Should correspond with the examples given below:

b) Reference to a chapter from a book:

c) Article from a journal:

Bentley, M.G., P.J.W. Olive, P.R. Garwood & N.H. Wright 1984. The spawning and spawning mechanism of *Nephtys caeca* (Fabricius, 1780) and *Nephtys homebergi* Savigny, 1818 (Annelida: Polychaeta). *Sarsia* 69: 63-68.

d) Electronic article, from online-only Journal:

Woo, K.L. 2006. Testing Visual Sensitivity to the Speed and Direction of Motion in Lizards. *Journal of Visualized Experiments* [Internet]. Available from: <http://www.jove.com/index/details.stp?id=127> (cited 18 February 2007).

Use ampersand (&) for double authorships in the text and for joint authorships in the reference list. Use "et al." in the text for references with three or more authors and in the reference list for more than 7 authors. Avoid multiple citations in the text, preferably including the earliest and most recent work. The reference list should be ordered alphabetically by first author's name, co-authors and year of publication. Names of journals should be written in full.

**Tables and Figures.** All figures and large tables should be presented in Font Times New Roman and separately. Photographs should be clear, have high contrast, and in digital format (tiff or jpg) with 300 dpi, with at least 15x15 cm. No original figures should be submitted before the MS has been accepted.

**E-mail Attachment.** All text file formats are accepted. Attachments must be identified with the author's last the file name and extension as follows: Bianchi\_text.doc, Bianchi\_fig1.tif, Bianchi\_tab1.xls.

**Article Processing Charges.** This journal does not charge APCs or submission charges.
